iWitness - The Stoning of Stephen

Introduction:

Being a follower of Jesus is costly. Jesus said as much in Luke's Gospel. But it's worth it. For in losing this life, we find eternal life in Jesus. Jesus' talk about taking up our cross and following him every day is dramatically seen in the story of Stephen.

I'd encourage you to go beyond the suggested reading of Acts 7:54-8:1a and read the entire story of Stephen. His story begins in Acts 6. The church is growing and needs additional leadership to help with the distribution of food to the widows. They choose seven men to oversee this ministry; Stephen is one of them. Stephen does more than feed the widows and his reputation grows. Stephen is arrested for his witness to Jesus. (Martyr comes from the Greek word 'to witness'.)

In Stephen's trial he continues to proclaim Jesus, and this witness gets him sentenced to death. The means of his execution will be stoning. As the sentence is carried out, scripture makes it clear that Stephen is in the hands of God and not the crowd. He's comforted by a vision, the crowd is angered by it. Immediately before his death Stephen speaks words that echo Jesus, and we are told that Stephen "fell asleep."

- 6. Who is mentioned in verse 58?
- 7. How might the stoning of Stephen have affected Saul?
- 8. How does Stephen's story encourage you in your life with Christ?

- 1. What have you learned about God?
- 2. What have you learned about the world?
- 3. What have you learned about yourself?
