Baptism Week

Introduction

Jesus' public ministry begins with his baptism. John the Baptist is baptizing in the Jordan river. A few things are clear about John's baptism. First, people were excited about it. All the city folks were traveling to the country to experience it, and it was a baptism symbolizing repentance. Most importantly, this baptism and John pointed to Jesus who would give a greater baptism.

The text makes it clear that Jesus doesn't need to repent, but "to fulfill all righteousness," Jesus urges John to baptize him. The voice of God after Jesus arises from the water helps us know who Jesus is. He's the Son of God!

The text in Romans helps us understand the Baptism we receive from Jesus. It's more than repentance. It's more than a symbol. It's about our relationship with Jesus. In baptism we have died with Jesus! And if we have died with him, we will rise with him! It is a promise from God, an act of the Holy Spirit that drowns the sinner, raises the saint, and empowers us to live a new life!
