Introduction

The question is: what does our faith have to say about what we do with all that we have? Jesus spoke about this often. Not because God needs your money, it all belongs to him anyway. Rather, he knows that nothing has the power to become an idol in our lives like our material possessions. The love of money is called greed. Greed is the root of all kinds of evil in this world.

“For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.” 1 Timothy 6:10

In our texts today from Exodus and Luke, we see that our generosity is not only the fuel for God’s work in the world, but also a central matter of our heart and relationship to God. God desires to be first in all aspects of our lives, including our finances. Jesus asks us to place our faith and trust in him, not seeking first our own comfort and security, but seeking first his kingdom and his righteousness.
